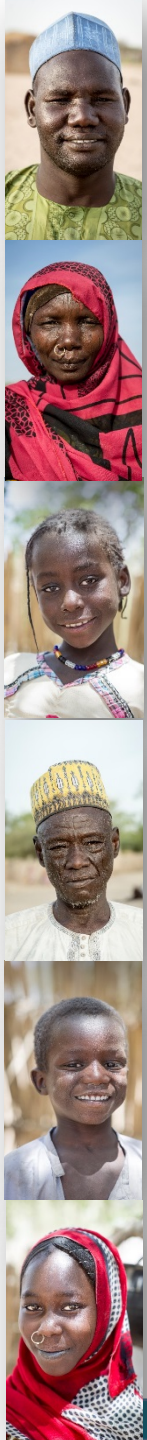
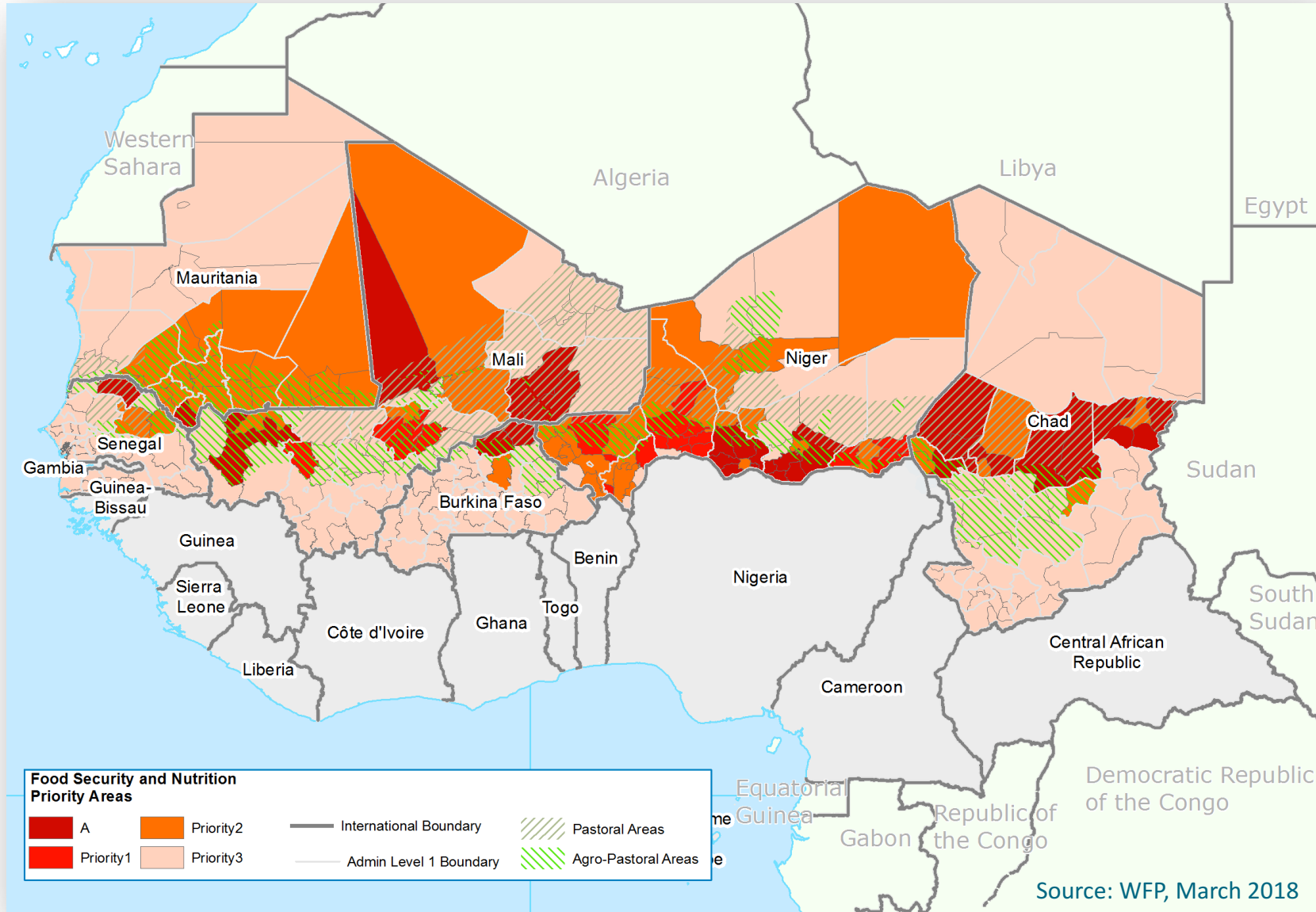

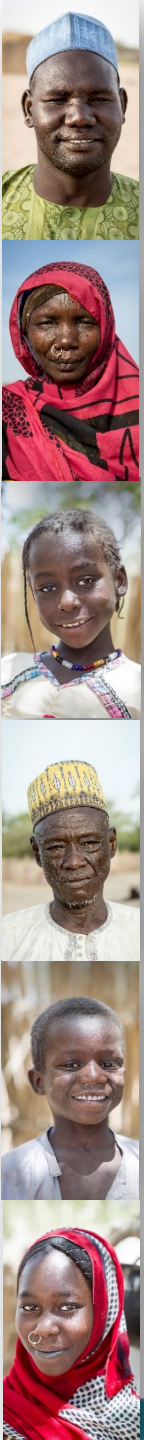

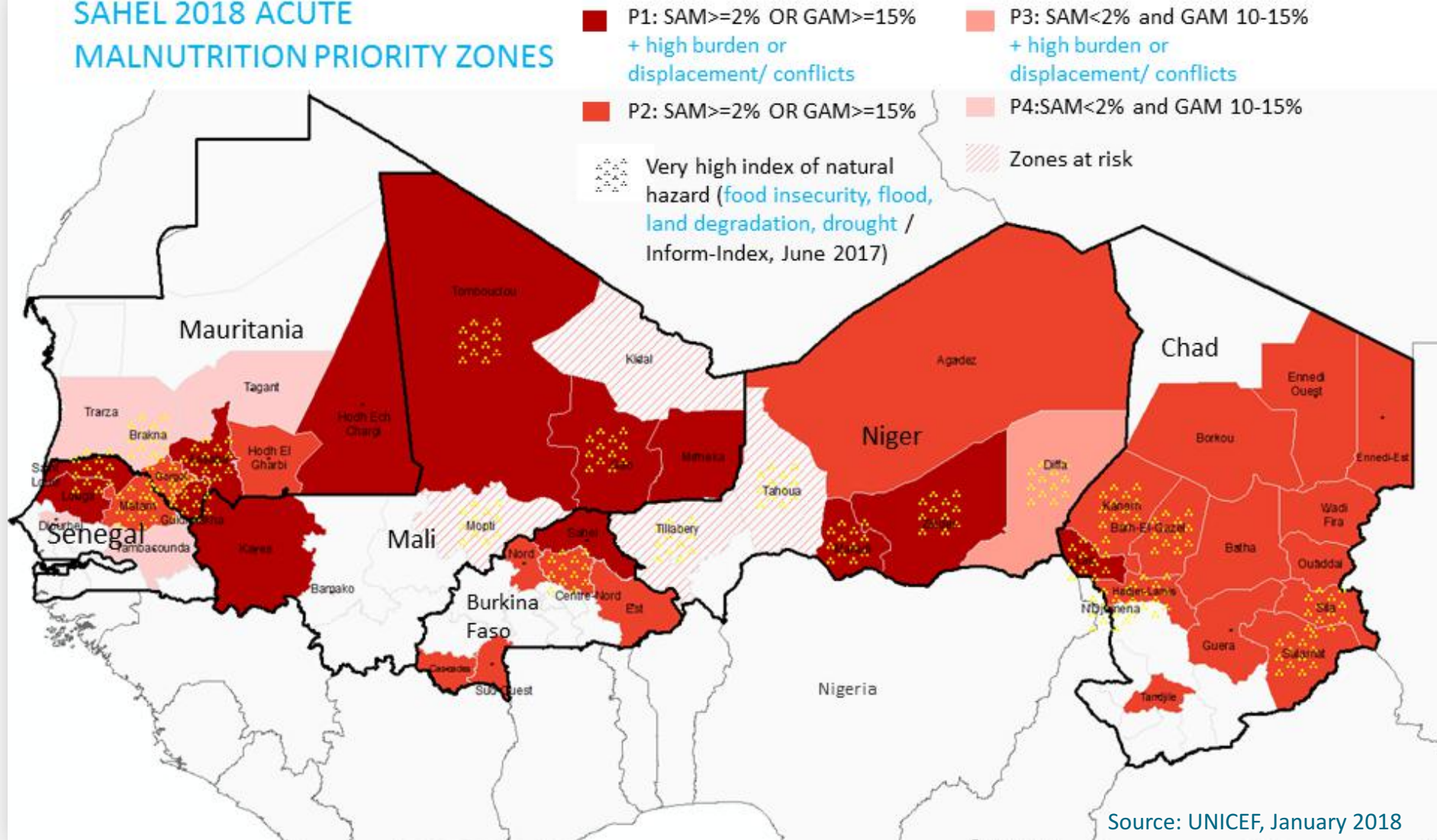

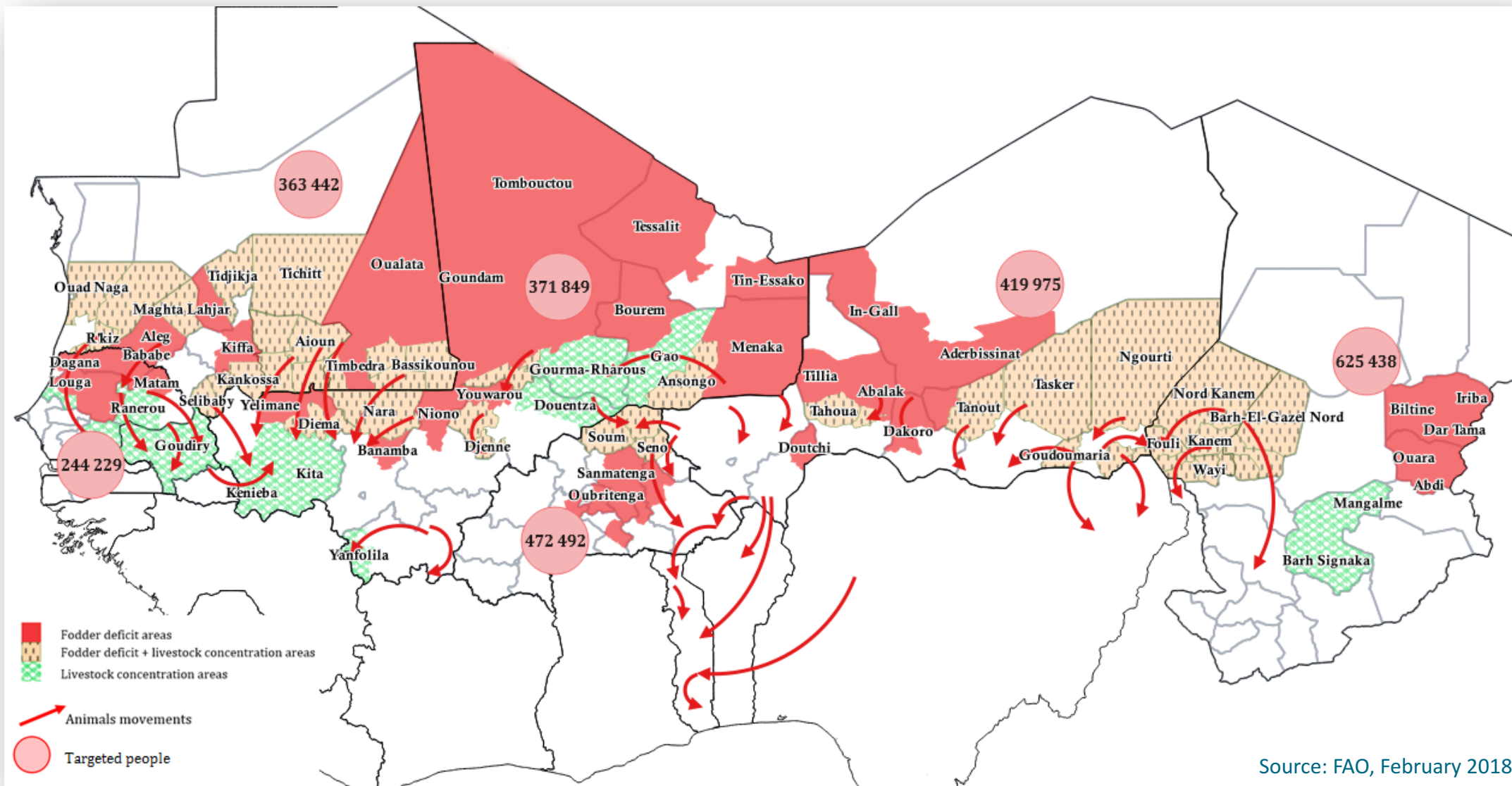

Activities

- Household food assistance (cash or in-kind) for families with malnourished children
- Scale-up of general food distributions (cash or in-kind) during the pre-lean and lean seasons in Priority area 1
- Treatment and prevention of moderate acute malnutrition in children (6-59 months) and pregnant and lactating women and girls
- Rebuilding the resilience of vulnerable communities and prepare for future shocks, including through Food-for-Asset programmes, school meals, nutritional support and lean season safety nets

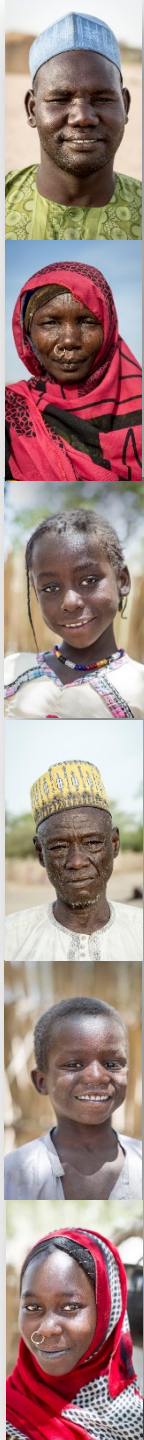


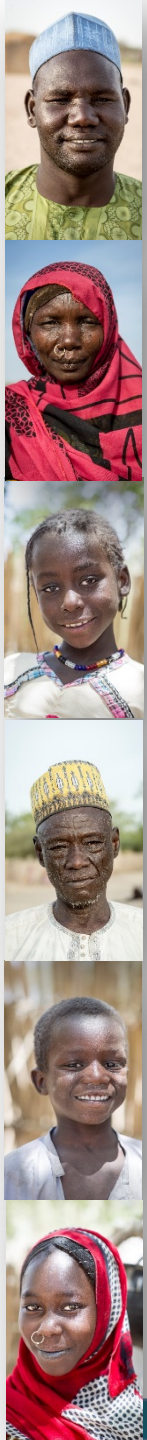

Activities

- Prevention of severe acute malnutrition through malaria chemotherapeutic treatment and insecticide-treated net
- Distribution of vaccination against measles
- Accelerated Infant and Young Child Feeding (supporting exclusive breastfeeding, appropriate complementary foods)
- WASH interventions to prevent diarrheal diseases
- Treatment and integrated management of severe acute malnutrition in children of 6-59 months and pregnant and lactating women and girls

* In the worst-case scenario, an additional USD 27.5 million is needed to assist an additional 511 000 children in the six identified countries.

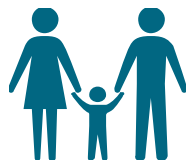
Activities

- Animal feed distribution
- Rehabilitation of water points for human and animal use
- Destocking/meat distribution/nutritional education
- Pasture regeneration/cash for work
- Milk production/transformation/distribution
- Animal health (vaccination and deworming)
- Restocking
- Transhumance management through cross-border conflict dialogue

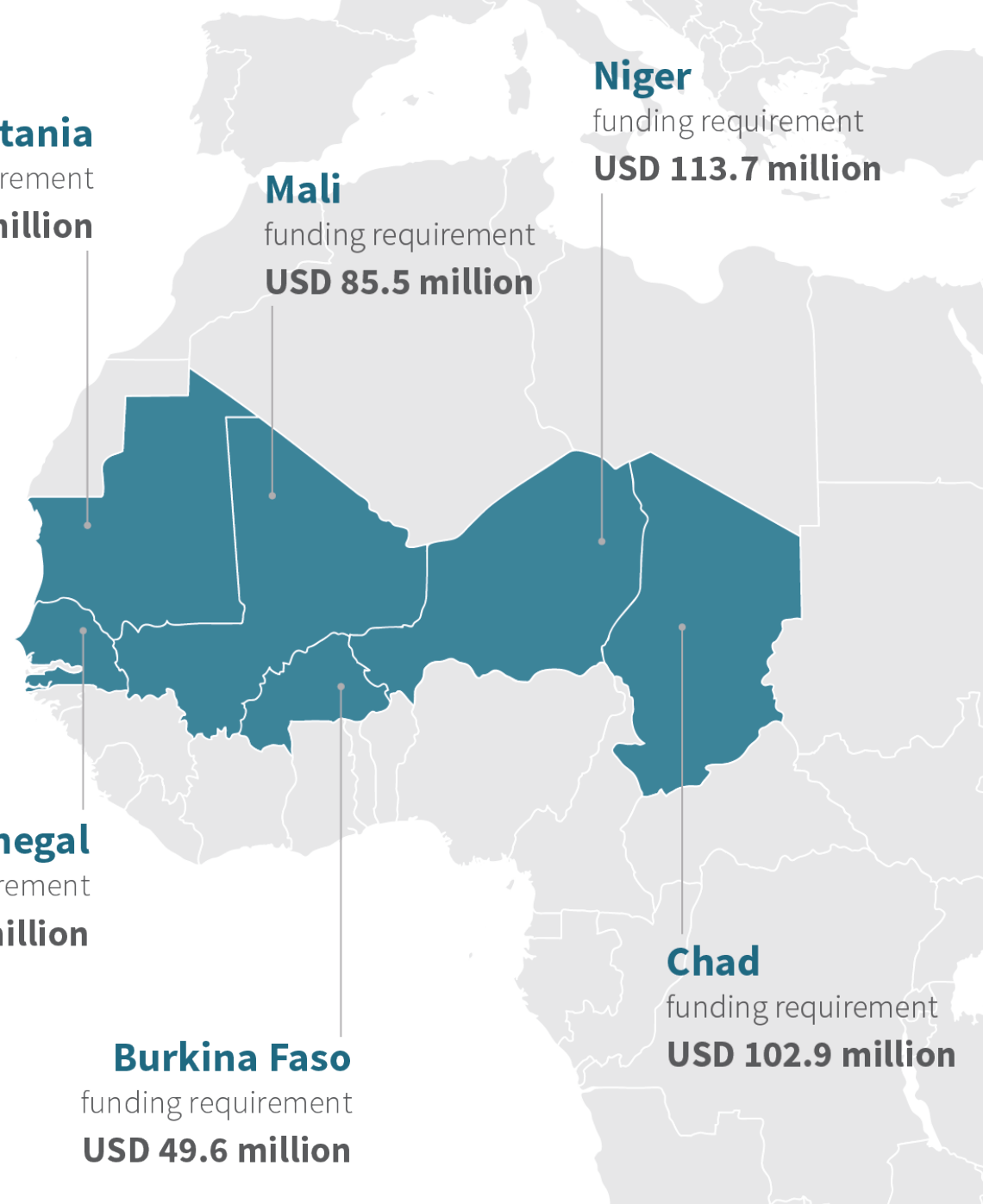
