





Global Update


- Latin America is becoming the new epicenter. Healthcare systems are becoming overwhelmed.
- Existing regional crises are being exacerbated:
 - Food insecurity & displacement in West Africa
 - Drought & economic uncertainty in South Africa
 - Insecurity and economic crisis in the Middle East
 - Desert locusts in East Africa and parts of Asia
 - Hurricane and monsoon seasons have arrived
 - Lean seasons approaching for many countries




Confirmed cases worldwide

USD 1.9 billion appeal


- **USD 1.61 billion** received against the USD 1.9 billion appeal to preposition and frontload
- **More than half** was directed to five operations:
 - Yemen USD 333 million
 - Syria USD 224 million
 - Somalia USD 129 million
 - Bangladesh USD 88 million
 - South Sudan USD 84 million
- Of the countries covered by the appeal more than half are reporting **over 50% in shortfalls**.
 - *Burkina Faso, Burundi, Cameroon, CAR, Colombia, Congo, Guinea, Honduras, Iraq, Liberia, Libya, Mozambique, Nigeria, Pakistan, Uganda*
- WFP's main priority is sustaining operations



Increasing Needs

- As needs grow, demands on WFP are increasing.
 - Needs-based plans are increasing.
 - Increases are most prominent in CBT.
 - Increased needs in large-scale complex operations – e.g. Nigeria, Somalia, South Sudan, Afghanistan, Yemen.
 - But also important scale-ups noted in traditionally smaller countries of WFP operations in **RBP**, **RBJ** and **RBD** (coastal).
- Country offices are finalizing augmented needs and we will release the **Global Scale-Up Plan** in the coming weeks.

Preliminary Data June-Dec (comparison today vs. March)






Global Humanitarian Response Plan

- In the GHRP, the food security sector are requesting USD 1.4 billion. At country level this is only 4.4% funded.
- WFP represents approximately 50% of the food security sector needs.
- The allocations for the country level clusters will follow the normal HRP process at country level.
- WFP is already scaling-up in many countries as per the GHRP.
- However, only half of WFP's total countries of operation are captured in the GHRP.
- **Yemen** – no requirements in the GHRP.

Global Service Provision

- Last week, the Executive Director visited three of WFP's humanitarian response hubs, two field hospitals and travelled on WFP's passenger services.
- All eight response hubs are fully operational.
 - WFP has dispatched over 10,800 m³ of COVID-19 items to 121 countries.
 - In the next six weeks, there is 68,000 m³ in the pipeline to be transported. This is around 103 Boeing 747s.
- In-kind support through assets from UAE, NATO, UK and Qatar.
- ECHO support through Humanitarian Air Bridge.
- WFP requested USD 965 million to sustain these services throughout 2020:
 - **USD 138 million** has been confirmed.
 - **USD 39 million** has been advanced.

This will only cover costs until the end of July.



Global Service Provision

Passenger Service

- The global passenger service is rapidly expanding.
- 109 flights have been operated to 24 destinations across Africa, Asia and the Middle East.
- 268 organizations have signed up to use the service.
- More government clearances are incoming and new routes are opening up soon across the rest of Africa, Asia, Latin America and the Middle East.

MEDEVAC

- Six MEDEVACs have been conducted so far.
- Field hospitals in Addis Ababa and Accra are in the final stages.
- Guidance has been released to all UN personnel on the MEDEVAC services.
