



Emergency funding mechanism. Revamped IRA with sufficient liquidity of IRA at all times to enable swift release of funds for pre-emptive sudden onset response




Development of Emergency Framework. Definitions and triggers for activation; immediate crisis response on "no regrets" basis; risk analysis; surge deployments






