



Global Climate Crisis


WFP will focus on better understanding climate risks, scaling up and mainstreaming adaptation measures and harnessing climate financing

WYW WFP endeavours to reduce protection risks faced by crisis-affected populations and to empower people to express their views and preferences, enabling safe and dignified access to food, nutrition and other essential needs



Gender Equality & Women's Empowerment

WFP will purse a gender-transformative approach, by investing in and advancing gender equality and women's **empowerment**, to ensure that all people have equal opportunities, access to resources and a voice in decision-making





WFP will **integrate nutrition at scale** by investing in programmes, operations and platforms that tackle underlying and immediate drivers of poor diets and malnutrition, while expanding access to nutrition services
