Lessons learnt from the 1G CSP

(SF Decentralized Evaluation, FNG and COHA studies, Climate Adaptation Response Analysis, consultations with government and partners)

Four programmatic shifts in the 2G CSP

Home Grown School Feeding is linked to local **value chains**. **Nutrition** is mainstreamed. **Crisis response** and **resilience** are integrated.

Improve **integration and synergy** across programmes

Mainstream **climate change adaptation**

National capacity for **early warning** is strengthened. **Rural communities** are more resilient to climate change.

3. Support the **national social protection system**

4. Strengthen **transversal issues across interventions**

National partners are provided with **capacity strengthening and technical support** to build a nutrition-sensitive and shock-responsive **social protection system**.

Disability inclusion, gender equality and women's empowerment, and environmental sustainability aspects are streamlined
