Round Table context

Collaboration and partnerships are central for impactful and sustainable resilience programmes. In today's volatile world characterised by increasingly complex drivers of risk and multifaceted shocks and stressors, it is beyond the capacity of any single actor to build resilience. Bringing together complementary expertise and resources to deliver multi-sectoral and multi-level interventions are therefore essential for effective resilience programming. This resilience Round Table on partnerships is part of a series of Executive Board events organised ahead in conjunction with the resilience policy evaluation and planned policy update in 2024. Following the Round Table in July 2022, this session is an opportunity for deeper discussions on WFP's partnerships in resilience programming.
