Rec 1. Strategic repositioning & contingency plans

Agreed

- ✓ WFP's value proposition and strategic focus to guide the new CSP
- Consultations with stakeholders on areas of intervention
- Development of partnerships strategy including resource mobilization
- New organizational structure and strategic staffing
- Develop a SharePoint-based centralized knowledge repository
- Recurrent cross-functional internal coordination meetings

Rec 2. Strategic framework for community resilience

Agreed

- Development of a theory of change; for the resilience programme, results framework, and monitoring systems
- Development of a community engagement and information sharing plan
- Standardized training packages for cooperating partners

Rec 3. Emergency Preparedness enhancement

Agreed

- Engage with the Government at the national, provincial and municipal levels
- Engage in particular with the Disaster and Emergency Management (AFAD) at the national level
- Arrange a workshop for private and public
- sector to present WFP Emergency preparedness activity and plans
- A strategic and flexible approach to addressing capacity needs, including recruitment of personnel with specialized expertise


CSP strategic direction: investing in strategic partnerships to enhance the effectiveness of humanitarian interventions

- focus on filling prioritized gaps drawing on WFP's comparative advantage in supporting refugees, emergency preparedness and response, institutional capacity strengthening, and service provision
- ➤ leverage the complementary strengths of WFP and Türkiye to enhance global emergency response efforts working toward the shared goal of addressing global food insecurity
- pave the way for WFP's responsible programmatic exit post-2028 and an alternative presence in Türkiye



Focus and alignment: refugee response, capacity strengthening and service provision in line with national and UN priorities

- > **Duration: 3 years** (2026-2028)
- ➤ Budget: USD 51.6 million (~17.2 million per year)
- > Reach: 52,500 unique direct beneficiaries



Sustainability and transition: WFP in Türkiye post-2028

- Phase-out of WFP's support to declining in-camp refugee population will be carefully planned with authorities
- Strengthened local and private sector capacities in emergency preparedness and response facilitating WFP's programmatic exit
- ➤ Continued strategic collaboration between WFP and Türkiye post-CSP in addressing global humanitarian challenges
- WFP's global food procurement and supply chain footprint as entry point for positioning WFP's presence in Türkiye through a regional humanitarian and supply chain hub

Outcome

Targeted refugees and other crisis-affected people in Türkiye can meet their basic needs, including nutritious food, all year round.

Outputs

- 1.1. Targeted refugees receive assistance to meet their basic food requirements and other essential needs (Tier 1).
- **1.2.** Crisis-affected people receive assistance to meet their basic food requirements and other essential needs (Tier 1).

Activity

1. Provide food and non-food assistance to crisis-affected people, including refugees living in camps or in transition.

WFP Türkiye CSP (2026 – 2028)



Outcome

By 2028, enhanced strategic partnerships are leveraged to facilitate efficient support to crisis-affected and at-risk people inside and outside of Türkiye, enabling them to meet their basic needs and build resilience.

Outputs

- **2.1.** Stakeholders, including government entities, and affected communities, benefit from enhanced systems and capacities to prepare for, and respond to disasters, mitigating the effects of shocks and stressors on food security (Tier 3).
- **3.1.** The Government of Türkiye benefits from technical assistance to enhance national social protection programmes, enabling them to better meet the needs of at-risk people (Tier 3).
- **4.1.** Humanitarian and development actors, including United Nations agencies, benefit from the provision of on-demand services that facilitate efficient and effective operations (Tier 3).
