Country Context



Food security & Nutrition: Around **3.4 million Ivorians are food insecure**. Over 20% of children under five suffer from chronic malnutrition and about 70% suffer from anemia.



Agriculture: Shift from food crops to cash crops: reduced local food availability, degraded soils and increased vulnerability to climate change. Sector dominated by smallholder farmers with limited access to markets, finance, and technology.



Regional disparities: Approx. **38% of the population** lives below the poverty line (55 % in rural and northern regions), due to informal sector domination and limited social protection.



Education: Despite significant progress in expanding access to education, **2.3 million children** remain out of school.



External shocks: Sahel spillover with more than 70,000 asylum seekers from Burkina Faso.


