## Insight 1: WFP strategic positioning

- Leveraged WFP's comparative advantages in emergency response, logistics & food security and nutrition
- WFP adapted to increased needs & funding shortfalls by introducing biometric registration for refugees and adjusting ration sizes and duration of assistance



- Improved food security & nutrition outcomes for crisis affected communities in Karamoja but had limited effect for refugees
- Strengthened national and local capacities in shock-responsive social protection systems
- Gender sensitive activities addressing equal participation & empowerment, but root causes of gender inequalities are still a challenge



- Resource shortfalls & earmarking hampering effectiveness and sustainability
- Agricultural market support activities in Karamoja, and school feeding still dependent on WFP funding and implementation capacity
- Limited engagements with the private sector in support of food systems development and transformation

## Recommendations

Enhance programmatic integration & coherence across activities to maximize synergies and effectiveness

Clearly define & strengthen **WFP's role as an enabler** of sustainable government capacity and systems

Develop a more **strategic & sustainable approach** to partnerships

Improve the **design & sustainability** of resilience-building and self-reliance interventions

Strengthen the advancement of cross-cutting priorities

Enhance WFP's **thought leadership & catalytic role** in food systems transformation
