Significant Shifts in the Operational Context Since CSP Evaluation


Heightened Crisis

- De facto authorities control large areas in North and South Kivu
- Increased insecurity affecting population movements
- Forced returns and dismantling of IDP sites leading to secondary displacement and premature returns to unsafe areas

Increase Food Insecurity

- Food insecurity at unprecedented levels across the country
- Over 10 million people projected to face crisis/emergency levels in 2026
- 3 million affected in Eastern provinces, where WFP concentrates its operations.

- Refined emergency prioritisation strategy
- Continued
 assessment of transfer modalities
- Piloted e-voucher assistance, reaching 30,000+ individuals.

Rec 2. Transition to Resilience Programming

- Implemented joint resilience-building interventions
- Integrated nutrition considerations and improved ration adequacy

Rec 3. Data-Driven Decision-Making

Key actions

- Unified internal monitoring and community feedback mechanisms
- Enhanced community engagement for targeting sensitization

Rec 4. Strengthen Collaboration with Local Partners
