

Kuwait's Statement on Indonesia Country Strategic Plan (2026-2030) At WFP EB Session (November 2025)

Madam President, Excellencies and Distinguished Delegates,

The State of Kuwait welcomes the World Food Programme's comprehensive five-year strategic plan for Indonesia, which represents a significant commitment to strengthening Indonesian food security, nutrition, and disaster preparedness systems, despite notable achievements in reducing shrinking rates from 27.7% to 21.5% and food insecurity from 13.6% to 12% in recent years.

We have noted with appreciation that the Country Strategic Plan for the period 2026-2030 directly addresses critical challenges through two strategic pillars:

First, supporting the Government's ambitious free nutritious meals programme, which aims at reaching over 80 million children and vulnerable individuals by 2029.

Second, strengthening anticipatory disaster preparedness thereby this proactive approach will ensure vulnerable communities receive timely support.

Therefore, this strategic plan represents more than humanitarian assistance; it is an investment in Indonesia's future resilience. By aligning with Indonesia's 2025-2029 mid-term development plan and the UN sustainable development cooperation framework, WFP demonstrates its commitment to country-led development and South-South cooperation.

We recognize that this strategic plan provides a clear roadmap for collaborative partnership between WFP, the Indonesian Government, and stakeholders for the achievement of food security for all Indonesians.

In conclusion, Kuwait approves the Indonesia Country Strategic Plan (2026-2030) and invites the WFP Executive Board to approve it.
