

Under its current Emergency Operation (EMOP), WFP provides food assistance to internally displaced people (IDPs), returness and residents in the conflict-affected eastern Ukraine with standardised monthly food partels, vouchers or cash transfers. In addition, WFP targets food insecure individuals in formerly state-funded social institutions with monthly food entitlements.

The ongoing operation is covering two oblasts affected by the conflict. Donestsk and Luhansk. The use of the cash-based or in-kind modality depends on context specific needs, considering the degree to which an area is affected by the conflict. To identify the most suitable form of assistance, WIP has determined three context specific challenges: 1) areas of active conflict where residents are trapped, 2) areas recently retaken by the Government with fluid population movements, and 3) areas controlled by the Government receiving 100 yet the Government receiving 100 yet to Government receiving 100 yet to Government receiving 100 yet.



The 2016 Food Security Cluster strategy is being finalized and will be circulated among partners for endorsement. One of the main undertakings will be to set up a field coordination office in Kramatorsk to ensure that closer coordination takes place on a regular basis.

The Logistics Cluster is responsible for coordination, information management and, where necessary logistics service provision to ensure an effective and efficient logistics response in every operation. The cluster has transported 2,862 cm of aid items since its activation in February 2015. More than 20 organizations participate in the cluster in Ukraine.

In Numbers

594,899 Syrian refugees were assisted in January with USD 21.6

Highlights

In January, WFP assisted 594,099 Syrian refugees with USO 21.6. Approximately 32 percent of beneficiaries are female and 48 percent are male.
In February, WFP will aunch a nine month school feeding pilot project for 10,000 Lebanese and Syrian recoiling.



Funding Update

WFP's regional emergency operation (EMOP 200433) requires USD 131 million between February and April, equivalent to USD 10 m per week.



Situation Update

- UNHCR registered around 1.1 million Syrian refugees in Lebanon. It is the world's largest concentration of refugees compared to its population. The influx is placing significant strain on Lebanese resources and communities.

 As the Syrian crisis continues. WP the world's largest
 humanitarian agency fighting hunger is increasingly

 The 2015 multi-sectoral Vulnerability Assessment of
 Syrian Refugees (VASyR) in Lebanon shows a continued
 deterioration of the food security situation among
 refugees across the country compared to 2014.
 Specifically:
- 0.70 percent of households are below the poverty line (USD
- 3.84/percent of households are below the survival minimum expenditure basket:
 6 61 percent of households are applying emergency and crisis.

WFP Response

- WFF* response
 In Lebano, WFP provides assistance to vulnerable Syrian
 refugees and Palestinian refugees from Syria through
 cards and cash transfers. E-crash are the principle
 modality of assistance as local markets are capable of
 providing sufficient food. Addisonally, they allow
 beneficiaries to choose the food they want to eat.
- Massive funding constraints in 2015 meant that tough decisions were made to prioritise less assistance to the needlest refugee households. In 2016, WFP is only able to provide 80 percent of the intended ration of USO 27 to beneficiaries. With such sustained constraints, WFP is

 WFP provides assistance to the Ministry of Social Affairs through the National Poverty Targeting Programme (NPTP). Through the programme, vulnerable Lebanese receive USD 30 per month for food.

- In January, WFP assisted 594,899 Syrian refugees with USD 21.6. That assistance is limited to five persons in a household, meaning that the maximum a household can receive is USD 108 in a month. In February, WFP intends to assist the same refugees with USD 21.6.
- WFP also assisted 20,000 Palestinian refugees through UNRWA's ATM card programme as well as 27,000 vulnerable Lebanese by providing technical assistance to the government's NPTP programme.
- In February, WFP will launch a nine month school feeding pilot project. 10,000 Lebanese and Syrian pupils will receive snacks upon suitable school attendance.

- □ In 2016, sector priorities have been established to:
- D Provide direct and critical food assistance to ensure improved food availability through in-kind food assistance for example with food parcels and community kitchens, and improved food access through cash-based transfers for food;
- © Improve agricultural livelihoods by increasing production capacity of vulnerable small-scale farmers and by increasing employment opportunities in the food and agriculture sector;
- Improve nutrition practices and households' dietary diversity; and
- D Strengthen food security information systems and coordination mechanisms.

Logistics Cluster

In January, WPP dispatched 5,500 metric tons of bulgur, chickpeas, lentils, vegetable oil and white beans by road from Beirut Port to Damascus for WPP's emergency operation inside Syria.

Partnerships

- WFP works closely with the Lebanese government and has key relationships with the Ministry of Social Affairs. WFP is also strengthening partnerships with the Ministry of Agriculture and the Ministry of Education and Higher Education. Maintaining and building upon these relationships is key to WFPs long-term planning as it looks at diversifying interventions.

 For its e-card activities, WFP works with eight non
 -governmental organisations: Action Contre La
 Faim, Danish Refugee Council, InterSOS, Mercy
 Corps, Première Urgence Alde Médicale Internationale,
 Save the Children, SHEILD and World Vision.
- WFP continues to liaise closely with the American University of Paint on the development of a new targeting formula which will assist with accurately identifying the most vulnerable populations.




