**Who we are**

- **77 million people** directly served in **81 countries**
  - ✓ **17.4 million children** received school meals/take home rations
  - ✓ **11 million young children and mothers** received specialized nutrition

## 2017 prioritized plan of work:

- **3.3 million tons of food** USD 2.8 billion (56% of programme)
- **Cash based transfers** USD 1.15 billion in 54 countries (23%)
- **Capacity development** USD 340 million (7%)



# Our people



- **15,800 staff**
- 83% from developing countries
- 78% locally recruited
- 34% women, 66% men (all staff); 42% women, 58% men (international)

# Operational footprint

WFP has greater **procurement**, **logistical** and **delivery** capacity to the world's most vulnerable people than any other humanitarian organization

On any day WFP is managing:

- 5,000 trucks
- 70 aircraft
- 20 ships
- 650 warehouses



- **Vulnerability Analysis and Mapping (VAM)** combines traditional assessment methods with innovative technologies to establish the underlying causes of food insecurity
- **mVAM** allows for food security surveys and high frequency data collection by mobile phone to monitor situation in remote or dangerous locations
- **Geospatial Analysis** of real-time seasonal forecasts to highlight developments of human concern
- **Food security assessments** through Comprehensive Food Security and Vulnerability Analyses (CFSVA) and Emergency Food Security Assessments (EFSA)
- **Market assessments** analyze the impact of higher food prices on households' food security situation.

# Common services

- We manage the **United Nations Humanitarian Air Service** (UNHAS)
- We manage the **UN's humanitarian warehouse hubs** (United Nations Humanitarian Response Depots) in six locations around the world
- We provide **logistics services** directly to the humanitarian community, e.g. inter-agency warehouses, transport services and civil military coordination during Hurricane Matthew response in Haiti
- We coordinate **logistics operations** for the humanitarian community in major emergencies



# Humanitarian system support

WFP is the coordinator (“cluster leader”) for the humanitarian community in:

- Food Security (with FAO)
- Logistics
- Emergency Telecoms
