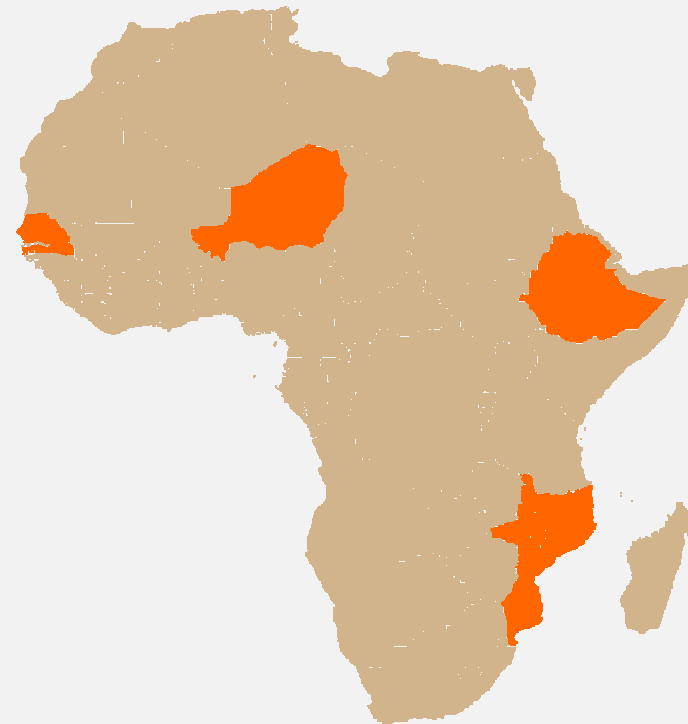

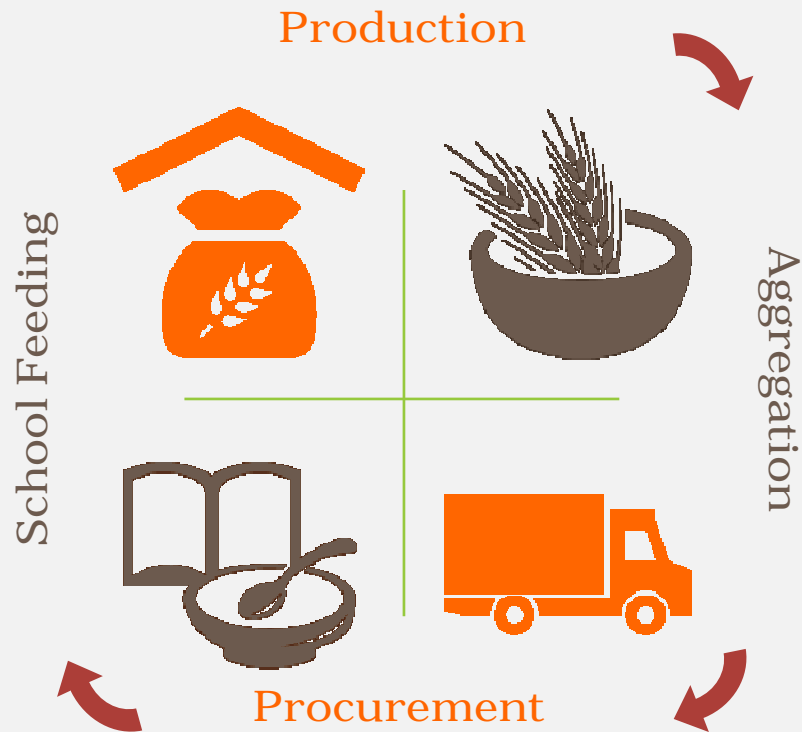

PAA Objectives

- **Goal:** To contribute to the progressive realization of the Human Right to Adequate Food (HRAF) by reducing the social and nutritional vulnerability of poor, small-scale farmers and school pupils.
- **Outcome:** To promote the food security of school pupils and small-scale farmers' access to institutional markets by implementing local food purchase initiatives for food assistance through a jointly designed and implemented project, with the engagement of governments, the UN agencies and civil society.
- **Outputs**
 - Strengthened productive and organizational capacity of small-scale farmers' associations to supply for local institutional food purchase programmes' demand
 - Improved or implemented local food purchase programmes through contracts with smallholders associations for dietary diversification in school feeding programmes.
 - Governments and international agencies have strengthened capacity to formulate and implement action and partnership strategies in order to enhance national local food purchase programmes as a social protection policy for food assistance (school feeding) and agricultural recovery by providing a source of effective demand for local smallholders .



PAA Africa works at three levels of public policies:

1. Implementation
2. Programing
3. Policy

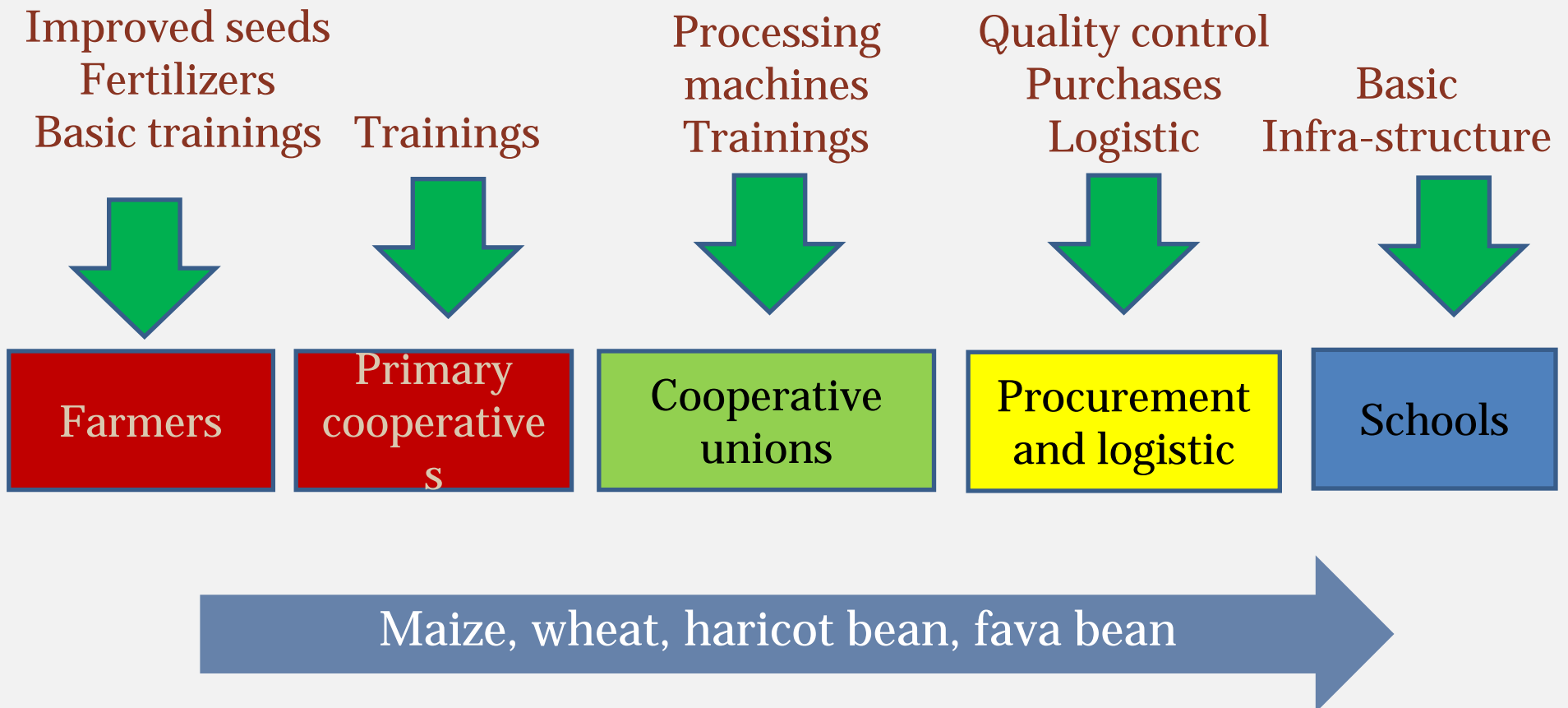
Combining knowledge and operational components.

Operational – adapted pilots: in partnership with governments, FAO provides support to farmers and farmers’ organizations (supply), and WFP on post-harvest, farmer organizations, procurement and school feeding (demand).

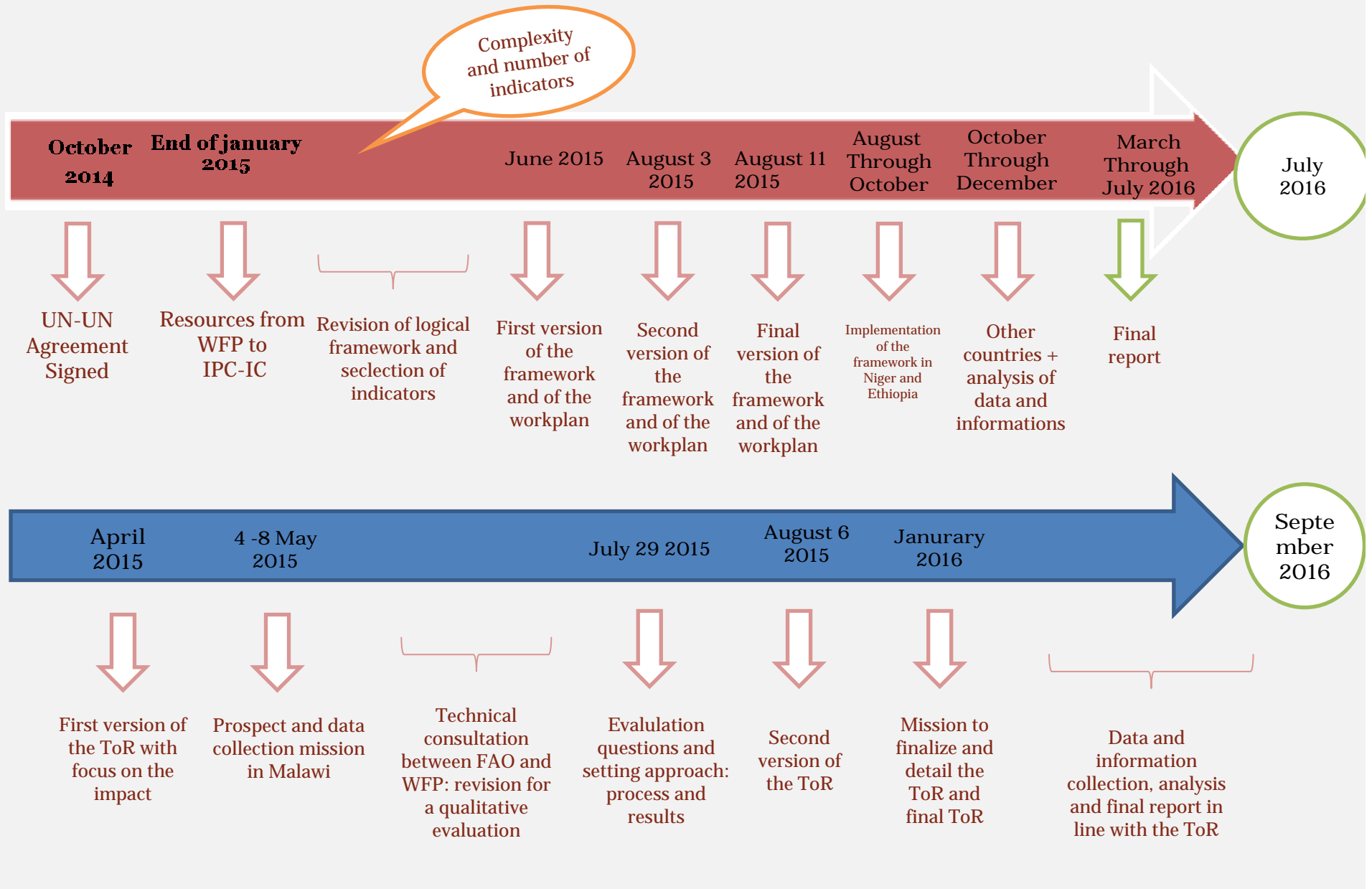
Knowledge - technical support to national capacities for local food purchases, international knowledge sharing, government and civil society dialogue on public policies, M&E.

PAA Africa Scale Up (2016 – 2019)

Key challenges

- Limited government local procurement programmes in place
- Limited programmatic approach as regards participation
- Constrained long-term access to inputs, and technical assistance for farmers, limited sustainability of agricultural systems
- Discrepancies between procurement models and FOs interests and capacities
- Constrained school capacity to handle locally procured food
- Limited programme funding
- Restricted M&E capacity

Scaling-up improvements

- Work in support to government led programs in local procurement programmes;
- Programme methodology and strategy for civil society participation
- Support sustainable systems of food production and and progressive diversification
- Continuous development of attractive models of local food procurement
- Support to schools' capacities to handle locally purchased items
- Resource mobilization
- Improve monitoring and evaluation
