# 1. Major factors affecting WFP in 2015




#### 1. Major factors affecting WFP in 2015

- > Exposure to armed conflict, terrorism, crime, and unrest
  - 1 WFP staff presumed dead kidnapped in early 2015 (South Sudan)
  - 2 WFP staff killed in conflict related violence (South Sudan)
  - 1 WFP staff member killed in RTA (Pakistan)
  - 5 WFP Partner staff killed in violent criminal act (Sudan and South Sudan)
  - 3 WFP Contractor staff killed in conflict related violence (C.A.R.)
  - Evacuation (Yemen) and relocation (CAR, Afghanistan) due to armed conflict
  - Assembly of staff due to coup d'etat (Burkina Faso)
  - Access constraints due to conflict: Yemen, Syria, Iraq, S. Sudan, Libya, Ukraine
  - Looting of WFP food trucks (Mali, (C.A.R.)




### Trend of security incidents involving WFP personnel/assets






#### Distribution of security incidents by incident type



#### 3. Security Efforts

- Operational focus on cohesion and pro-active engagement
  - Development of active shooter training/response
  - Engagement with partners inside and outside UN
- Focused Analysis and Info Management
  - Close cooperation with WFP Emergency Preparedness and other UN ops centres
- > Blast/Technical assessments
  - Deployment of blast mitigation measures, armoured vehicles etc.
- > Strengthening of the security capability on RB-level
  - Deployment of Security Analysts on RB-level
- Access Strategy
  - > Afghanistan, Burundi, Mali, Ukraine
- > Gender-mainstreaming
  - WSAT, Recruitment of female security staff, Review of reports
- Road Safety Campaign
