

Results from Operational Brief Survey

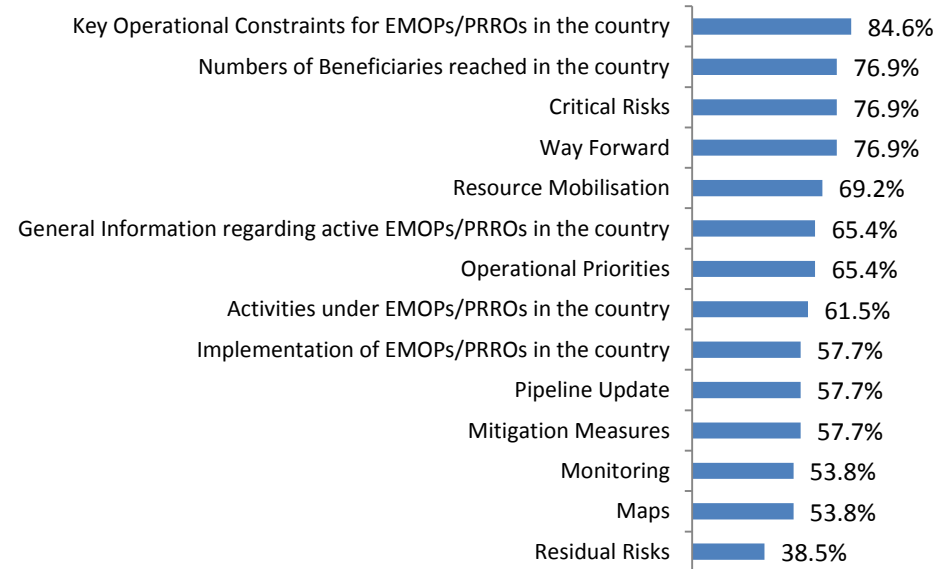
Distributed after previous Operational Briefing in November - 72% Sample respondents by 20 December

Key findings:

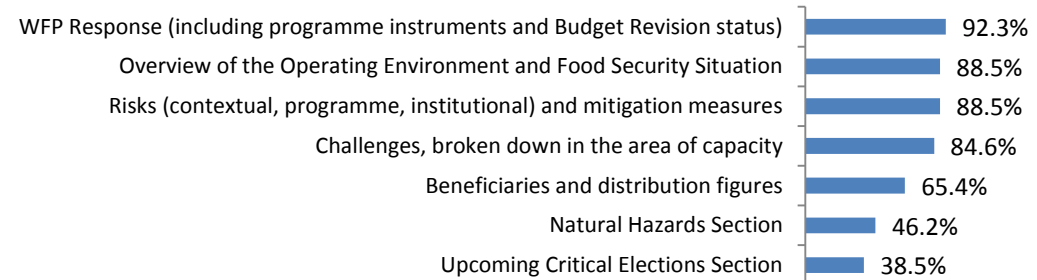
According to the respondents, the operational briefs are useful, well-structured and highly appreciated, especially the interactive and open discussion.

- **80%** consider the **operational brief very relevant to their work.**
- **92%** consider the **selection of Case Studies highly appropriate.**
- **84%** consider the **selection of countries for the Global Overview highly appropriate.**

The Way Forward

Feedback from Member States	WFP's Proposed Solution (assuming available documents are reviewed)
Adjust frequency of operational briefing, leaning towards more frequent briefings on operational information.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Maintain informal quarterly briefings▪ Include more operational information in Regional Bureaux presentations during formal Executive Board sessions.▪ Provide written briefings on major operations in between informal operational briefs.
Provide further details on resourcing, supply chain, and prioritisation of funds.	WFP will provide a standard one-page document on its supply chain and resource allocation for future quarterly briefs.
More information about coordination, partnerships, and critical risks	Further information on these points will be expanded upon in presentations as well as in the posted documents.
More in-depth operational briefs specific countries, while avoiding information repetition.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">▪ Develop a method to share additional information on underreported /underfunded emergencies via website and through Regional Bureaux briefings.▪ Briefings to be as succinct as possible and avoiding repetition of information on website.
Improve ways to access information, including maps and documents	Explore development of mobile/tablet app to the EB web facility
