WHAT IS 'NEW' ABOUT THE NEW RESPONSE MODEL

- Emergency Preparedness as Risk Management.
- Predictable Response Capacities.
- Fully Enabled Response Management.
- Alignment with External Environment: Partnerships and Services.
- Institutionalised: Normative and Financial.

Goal: Timely, appropriate, efficient and effective response to a range of crises

PREDICTABLE RESPONSE CAPACITIES

Food Assistance

> Food stocks for general & specialised feeding (e.g. FPF).

Funds

Improved Advance Financing (IRA, Working Capital, etc.).

Human Resources

> Emergency Response Roster and associated training.

Non-Food Items

Essential equipment to support deployed teams.

Logistics

Surface (trucks and boats) and Air (fixed and rotary) transport.

Information

Operational Information: Data, reports, geo-spatial.

FULLY ENABLED RESPONSE MANAGEMENT

KNOWLEDGE

Knowledge Management, (e.g. Lessons Learned.)

NORMATIVE

Guidance on Emergency Preparedness & Response, Civil-Military Coordination, Ready-to-Eat commodities, etc.

PROCEDURES

Standard/streamlined SOPs & protocols.

ACCOUNTABILITY

Revised delegations of authority, clear roles & responsibilities.

SYSTEMS/ TOOLS

Streamlined and integrated systems, appropriate tools.

ALIGNMENT WITH EXTERNAL ENVIRONMENT: PARTNERSHIP AND SERVICES

GOVERNMENTAL

- National Level: National Disaster Management Organizations.
- Regional Level: Regional organizations.

NON-GOVERNMENTAL

- Inter-agency Coordination: Transformative Agenda (Clusters etc.).
- Humanitarian Common Services (UNHAS, UNHRD, Base Camps, etc.)
- NGOs: International and National.
- Private Sector.

WAY FORWARD.....

- Flexible Implementation Approach:
 - Testing and real-time application.
 - Continuous re-alignment.

 - PREP Evaluation.
 - Emergency Preparedness & Response Policy in 2014.
- Sustainable Resource Base:
