Advancing GEWE through national school meals

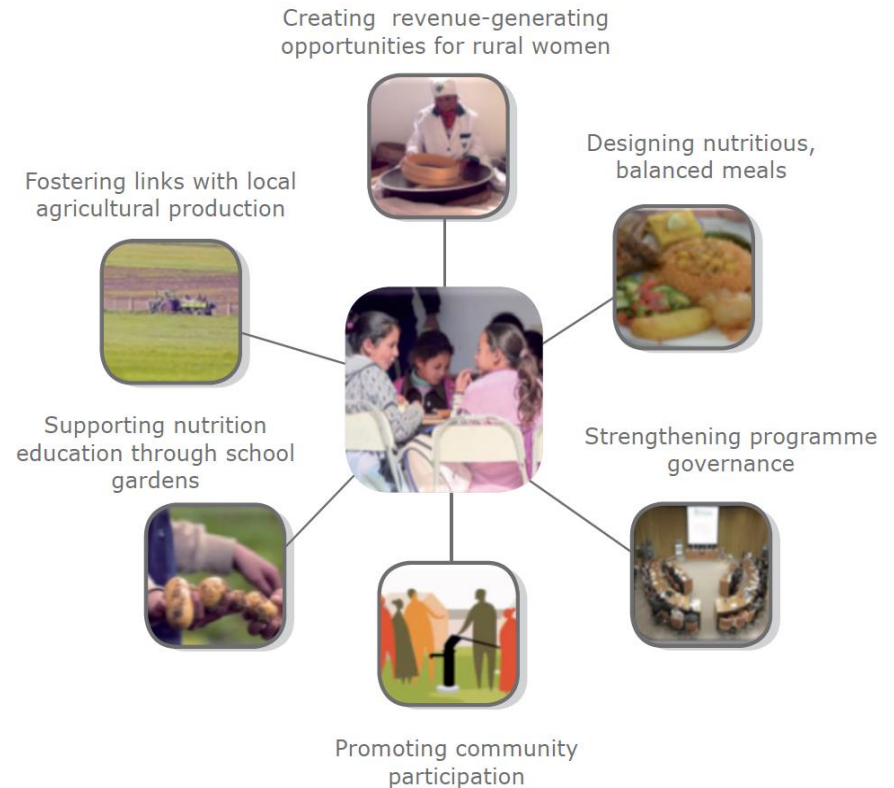


➤ Gender-transformative national programmes - promoting change in gender based relations and roles:

➤ Gender marker: 2A

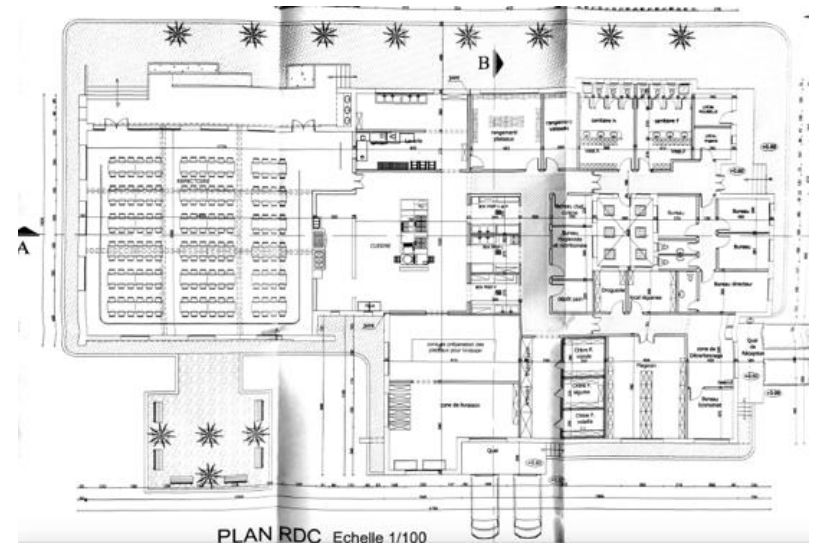
A multi-dimensional approach for sustainable school meals
