# Why is India Important ?

## ***India snapshot***

- 7<sup>th</sup> largest country
- Population: 1.3 billion
- Largest democracy in the world
- GDP: USD 8.727 trillion
- GDP Growth rate (IMF est.2017-18) > 7%
- Self Sufficient in food grain/milk
- Largest Food Safety Nets Global-PDS, MDM, ICDS
- Digital India – National ID Aadhaar Card



## ***Challenges***

- Approximately 25% Global Undernourished in India: 190.7 million
- Stunting 38.4%
- Wasting 21%
- Anemia 48%-58%

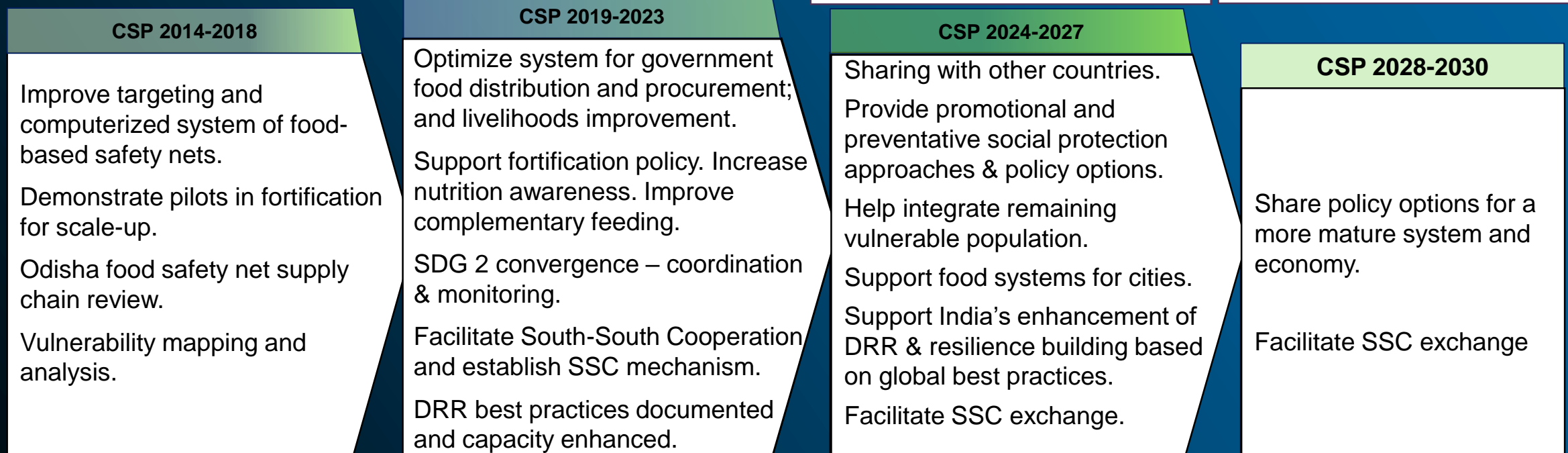
