1. Making reference to the draft full country strategic plan (CSP) for Bhutan for the period 2019–2023, this short-term interim country strategic plan (ICSP) consists of activities that continue WFP's current projects in the country. It seeks the Executive Board's approval by vote by correspondence of the implementation of such activities during the period from January to March 2019 pending the Board's approval of the CSP at its 2019 first regular session. This early start is necessary to provide operational continuity until the Executive Board's approval of the CSP.

- To ensure adequate governance and oversight, all strategic outcomes and activities under the short-term ICSP are based on previously approved projects and ongoing activities. The short-term ICSP will include no strategic outcomes or activities that do not stem from existing projects, and such outcomes and activities will be implemented only under the CSP after its approval by the Executive Board. Once approved, the CSP will supersede this shortterm ICSP.
- 3. Under the short-term ICSP WFP will assist the Government of Bhutan and partners in working towards the following two strategic outcomes through three activities:
 - > Strategic outcome 1: School-age children, women and vulnerable groups in Bhutan have improved nutrition in line with national targets by 2023 (Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 2.2)

Focus area: Root causes

Key activities

- Activity 1. Assist the Government in its transition to a national school nutrition programme based on an integrated approach to school feeding that connects school feeding to nutrition education, school health and school agriculture and embeds gender, environmental and social safeguards across all activities, with strengthened supply chains and the optimization of school nutrition infrastructure.
- Activity 2. Provide technical assistance to the Government and the national food production and trade sectors to ensure that sound policies are in place and ensure the quality and safety of fortified foods, especially rice, throughout their supply chains.
- > Strategic outcome 2: Government has strengthened capability to address food security and nutrition challenges and prepare for and respond to crises, including those resulting from climate change, by 2023 (SDG 17.9)

Focus area: Resilience building

Key activity:

- Activity 3. Through WFP's leadership of the emergency logistics and communications sector working group, provide the Government with gender-informed and vulnerability-focused capacity strengthening relevant to its management of national emergency resources and its development, enhancement and testing of national emergency response plans and coordination systems.
- 4. There will be no direct beneficiaries under the short-term ICSP.
