Introduction

The Executive Board (EB) Bureau has asked the World Food Programme (WFP) to facilitate engagement between EB Members and Non-governmental organizations (NGOs) who are WFP's Cooperating Partners (CPs) under the overall theme of "Partnerships for Peace". Members of the Board have been invited as have WFP's largest international NGO partners plus some that have engaged in programmes and discussions relevant to this Round Table. National and local NGOs selected in consultation with the regional bureaux and country offices have also been invited to participate.

This moderated Round Table Consultation will be made up of a series of panel discussions. Each panel will consist of representatives from international and local NGOs and WFP, with time allocated for discussions with participants in each panel. Questions may be submitted during the consultation.

Following opening remarks, the first panel will provide an overview of the recent consultations with NGO partners on WFP's next Strategic Plan. This will be followed by three panels, each focusing on a different aspect of the theme "Partnerships for Peace". All panelists have been asked to be forward looking and visionary with a focus on how our partnerships can be more strategic, and how we can do more with less.

Discussion 3: Disseminating and Applying Resolutions

United Nations Security Council Resolution 2417 (adopted May 2018), acknowledges the link between hunger and conflict, condemns the starving of civilians as a method of warfare as well as the unlawful denial of humanitarian access to civilian populations. The following question will be considered:

- What is needed to improve awareness and ensure the application of UNSCR 2417, and related resolutions especially given the deterioration of acute food insecurity that today several countries are facing and the need to prevent and address famine?
