Overview of the Policy and Programme function

STRATEGIC PLAN

Cohesive direction to guide the work of the entire organization over a four-year period

PORTFOLIO OF POLICIES

The normative framework within which the organization realizes its corporate goals as articulated in its strategic plan

COUNTRY STRATEGIC PLANS

Country offices, with Regional Bureaux as their first level of support, lead designing country specific plans which lay out the approach to programming in a specific country.

As part of this process, COs and RBx position WFP with national and regional partners and draw upon WFP's programme tools to improve food security & nutrition wherever there is need and wherever WFP can add value.

Policy function

- WFP currently has over **32 policies** in effect under the 2022-2025 Strategic Plan.
- An update of the portfolio of policies is submitted annually and can be found as the “**Compendium of Policies**” on the EB website.
- The **Policy Cycle**:
 - Identify need
 - Formulation
 - Implementation & Resourcing
 - Evaluation



Examples of our ongoing work include:

- Implementing the Local and Regional Food Procurement Policy.
- Implementing the Protection and Accountability to Affected Populations Policy.
- Updating the current policy on South-South and Triangular Cooperation.
- Updating the policy formulation policy.

Programmatic Priorities at WFP

- Broad range of programmatic areas which reflect **our mandate to deliver and enable through development and emergency interventions.**
- Humanitarian-Development-Peace agenda.
- Resilience & Integrated Programming.
- Food systems & Smallholder farmer support
- Climate Change and Disaster Risk Reduction.
- Social Protection systems.
- Country Capacity Strengthening/South-South Triangular Cooperation.
- Livelihoods & Food for Assets.



Country Strategic Plans and the Programme Cycle

CSP defines WFP's entire portfolio of assistance within a given country for a **five-year period**.

The design work is evidence-based and framed by the **Zero Hunger Strategic Review**, which looks at challenges, opportunities and priorities to achieve zero hunger by 2030.

CSP's are formally reviewed at their **mid-term mark** to identify corrections **and by a formal evaluation towards the end** to inform future WFP engagement in that country.

With the first generation of CSPs now complete worldwide, **we are currently developing the second generation of CSPs**.

Alignment with **UN reform**: our Strategic Reviews are more integrated into the **UN's Common Country Assessment**, and our CSP's are aligned with the **UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework**.
