 - Evaluation

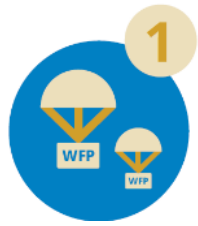

Country Strategic Plans

CSP defines WFP's entire portfolio of assistance in a country over **five years**.

CSPs undergo a formal **mid-term review** to identify corrections and a **formal evaluation towards the end** to inform future WFP engagement in that country.

Alignment with **UN reform**: our Strategic Reviews are more integrated into the **UN's Common Country Assessment**, and our CSPs aligned with the **UN Sustainable Development Cooperation Framework**.

Executive Board engagement and input is ensured through Informal Consultations and formal approval of CSPs at EB sessions
