#### **STRATEGIC OUTCOME 1**

Crisis-affected populations including refugees, IDPs, returnees and host population in Cameroon have safe access to adequate and nutritious food during and in the aftermath of crises.

**ACTIVITY 1:** Provide integrated food and nutritional assistance to crisis-affected populations to support their self-reliance and recovery needs

ACTIVITY 2: Provide capacity strengthening to Government and local humanitarian partners on emergency preparedness and response

### STRATEGIC OUTCOME 2

Children 6-23 months, adolescent girls, pregnant and lactating women and other nutritionally vulnerable groups in prioritized regions have improved nutrition status and resilience in line with national standards by 2026

ACTIVITY 3: Provide an integrated nutrition package to beneficiaries including access to nutritious food, quality care, SBCC, and capacity strengthening to prevent malnutrition

# What's different: Key changes from 1G CSP to 2G CSP

### **Country context changes**

- Rising needs (L2), access challenges; Increasing food insecurity – esp. NW/SW, and Far North
- CAR refugee influx, Nigerian refugee repatriation
- COVID-19 impact
- New National Development Strategy (2020-2030)
- New UN Cooperation Framework (2022-2026)
- Funding challenges / pipeline breaks

### **Programme changes**

- Transition relief beneficiaries to recovery and resilience activities
- Increased resilience activities including HGSF, support to SHF, livelihoods
- Capacity strengthening for EPR (SO1), resilience to support social protection, FSN analysis (CH)
- Use of humanitarian platform to deliver safety nets
- Increased use of CBT & digital solutions
- Improved partnership with Government, UN, IFIs, CPs for SDG2
- Better coordination with all stakeholders

### **Strategic changes**

- Holistic approach across triple nexus (incorporating conflict and climate change analysis)
- Food systems focus, nutrition integration
- Programme integration
- Analysis/evidence generation for better programme design and advocacy
- **Innovation** in digital transformation (esp. CBT and financial inclusion)
- Cross cutting concerns: nutrition, gender, protection, DI, AAP, environmental sustainability
- Shift from an actor to an enabler...
