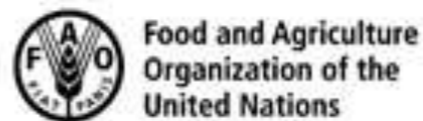

The initiative aims to raise awareness about unconscious gender bias and its impact in the workplace, field operations and daily life. In a dynamic and interactive way, the session would offer the possibility to recognize power dynamics where gender-based violence could occur or be reinforced.
