Previous positions include Head of Programming Division in the Programming, Studies and Prospective Division in the High Commission of the 3 N initiative and Director of Studies and Programming of the Ministry of Population, Promotion of Women and Protection of Children and Head of the Regional Service for the Territorial Development of Niamey. Abdoulkarim's qualifications include a Master's degree in Local Development Planning and a Master's in Geography.

Brenda Behan is the Director for Gender at WFP and has extensive experience in humanitarian and international development operations having worked with WFP and the US Government in various managerial and technical capacities. Mr. Juan Carlos Mendoza is IFAD's Director of the Environment, Climate, Gender and Social Inclusion Division. Mr. Mendoza joined IFAD from KPMG in New York, US, where he worked as Senior Director in the International Development Assistance Services, KPMG's unit serving multilateral development banks and international organisations. Prior to this, Mr. Mendoza worked as Managing Director of the Global Mechanism of the United Nations Convention on Desertification. Before that, he held different positions at the World Bank and the Green Climate Fund. He was most recently responsible for putting together a strategy for womenowned businesses for a large MDB and for green jobs in Central America in the context of post-COVID recovery. Mr. Mendoza possesses a master's in public policy and a master's in engineering from, respectively, Georgetown University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in the United States.

Jill Engen is a senior adviser working on gender equality in the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (Norad).
