WS1 - Optimise impact of local commodity purchases




WS2 - Increase volume and value of Regional Purchases through Commodity import substitution




WORKSTREAM 2 — IMPORT SUBSTITUTION


Global Food Crisis – accelerated LRFPP implementation

2021- 526,000 MT imported, value at over **\$180M**

2022, substitution efforts with \$50M injected in local economies
