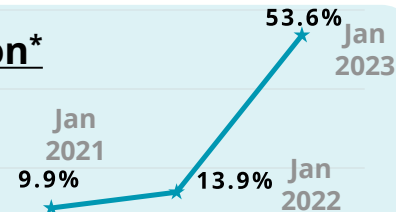

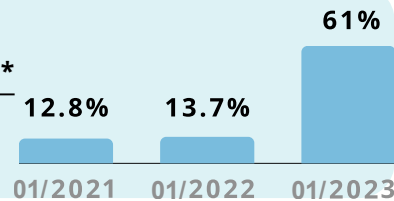

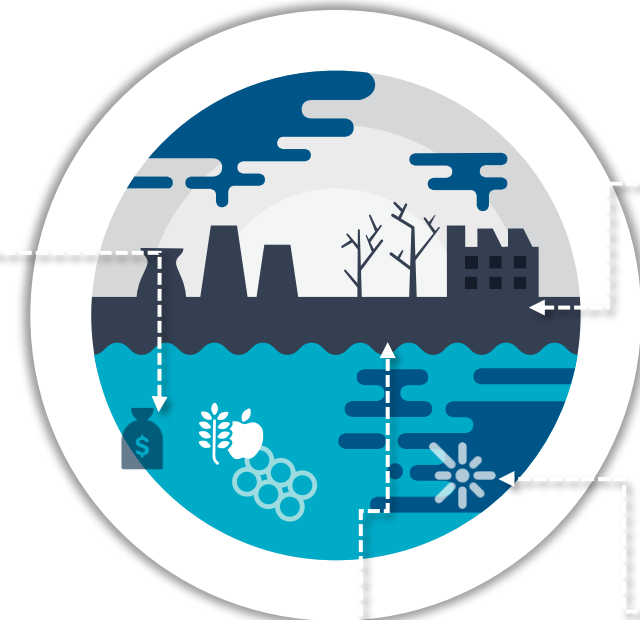
Inflation*

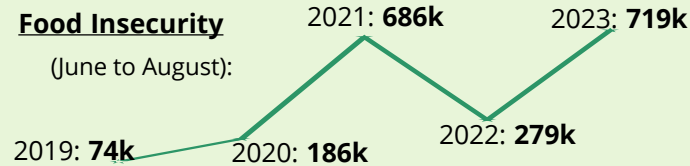

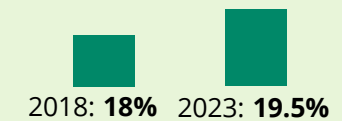
