The Partnerships and Innovation Department identifies key opportunities to maximize partnerships at all levels, to protect, grow and diversify our resources



Context, outlook and strategic response

The global humanitarian system is already stretched in responding to **growing needs** amid escalating crises of **conflict**, **climate change**, **and geopolitical tension** – compounded by **funding gaps**.

WFP's own funding outlook shows a **34% drop**, from US\$9.8 billion in 2024 to US\$6.4 billion in 2025, risking assistance **cuts for 16.7 million people**.

PI is currently leading the development of the **WFP Resource Mobilization Strategy** (RMS) 2026-2029 to enable the Strategic Plan.



PI Strategic Foci

Protecting, growing, and diversifying WFP's partnership and resource base adapted to each context, partner and approach;

Underpinning Country Offices and national governments as strategic anchors, and reinforcing field capacity to effectively build partnerships and mobilize resources, while maintaining a close presence at key partners' decision-making centres;

Strengthening organizational and staff capacity through training, improved information sharing, Al-enabled systems, leveraging innovation to enhance WFP's ability to respond effectively and efficiently while also scaling new solutions to reduce future humanitarian needs.
