Insight 1: Strategic positioning

- **Relevant to the needs of vulnerable refugees**, including women & persons with disabilities
- **Responsive to national priorities** for migration management with the emergency social safety net (ESSN)
- **Challenges with transition to development-oriented programming** after ESSN handover



Insight 2: Results

- **Effective emergency responses:** Strong performance in the delivery of the ESSN & the rapid and large-scale earthquake response
- **Livelihoods:** Individual benefits for participants, but lack of broader & sustainable outcomes at scale
- **Effective capacity development for the ESSN handover:** Highly capacitated national partner at the time of the handover
- **Cross-cutting results:** Humanitarian principles upheld & progress on equitable access, although not consistent



Insight 3: Partnerships and people

- **Partnerships a strength of WFP engagement** in Türkiye:
 - Expanded network of co-operating partners
 - Strong collaboration with the private sector
- But **limited strategic engagement** / WFP visibility constrained scope to capitalize
- **Human resourcing not always aligned** with evolving programmatic needs

Recommendations

Strategically reposition WFP considering its comparative advantages & reposition WFP for low-funding context.

Develop a strategic framework for support to community resilience.

Support the government's emergency preparedness & response efforts.
