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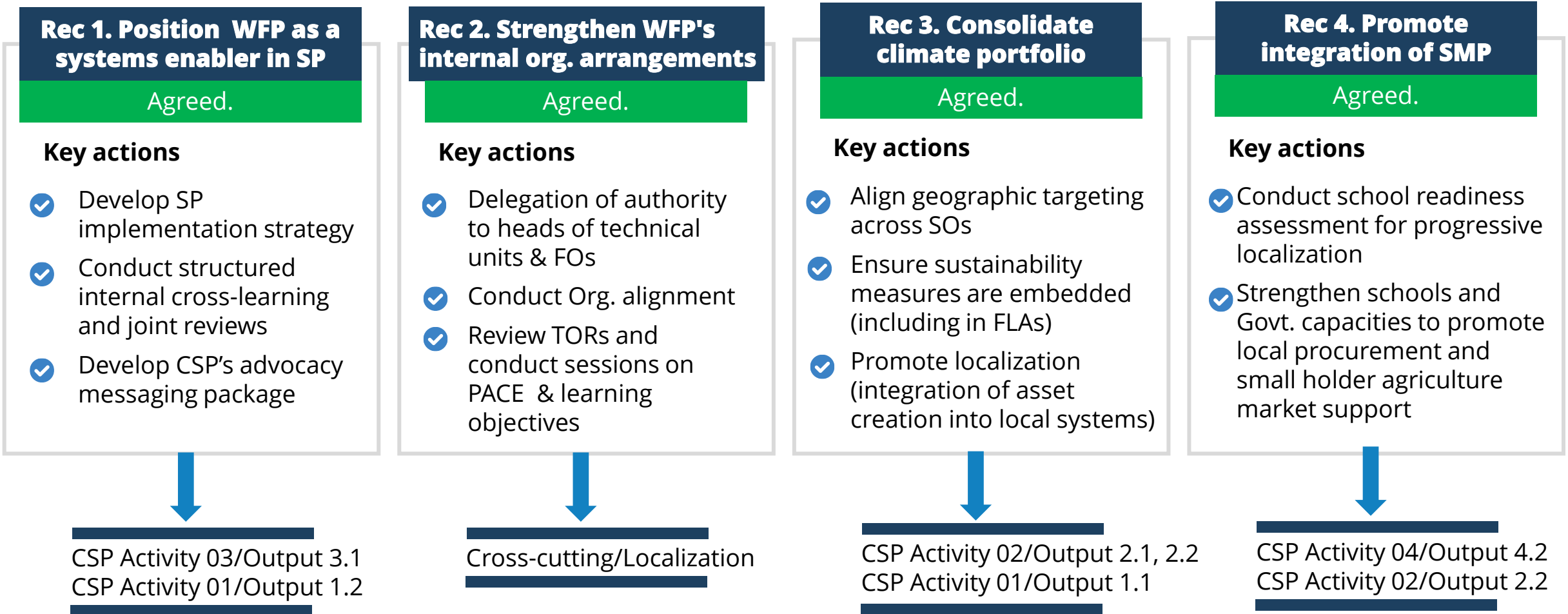

Tajikistan: Country analysis



Middle Income, Stable, Mountainous

Population: 10.7M (73% rural); 40% below 18 yrs; Economy growth: 8.4%; Remit. 49% of GDP; 93% mountainous cover.

Food Security improving but structural vulnerabilities remain

14.5 % food insecure; 54.7% marginally food secure; 74% spend more than 50% on food; 56% can't afford nutritious diet; 35% anemia among women.

Key vulnerable groups

Female-headed HHs; youth (90% of aged 15-24 NEET); children (50% vulnerable to malnutrition); Labor migrants.

Drivers of Food Insecurity

Poverty and limited livelihood diversification; remittances dependency; post-harvest losses; natural disasters; irrigation constraints; soil erosion, deforestation, pasture overuse

Major risks and shocks

Earthquakes, droughts, floods, extreme weather; Global food price volatility and supply disruptions; rural-urban divide; youth bulge



Strategic Outcome 1:

Emergency preparedness & Shock-responsive systems

Vulnerable populations in Tajikistan are supported by improved, coordinated and timely responses and anticipatory action, ensuring uninterrupted access to nutritious food before, during and after shocks.





Strategic Outcome 2:

Community resilience and Malnutrition Prevention

By 2030, vulnerable communities in Tajikistan achieve long-term food and nutrition security through reduced impacts of shocks, diversified income streams, and robust systems that generate rural employment and address malnutrition, thereby reducing future humanitarian needs.

Strategic Outcome 3:

National school feeding and social protection system strengthening

By 2030, vulnerable populations in Tajikistan are supported by a targeted shock-responsive social protection system, underpinned by a progressively nationalized school meal programme that meets the nutrition needs of primary schoolchildren, and partners benefit from enhanced efficiency through on-demand services.
